Evacuation Procedure

- Kaiako blows whistle. All tamariki go to an adult with a hi vis vest. All adults and tamariki move to adult with a whistle and the designated evacuation point for Spa Park Playground (picnic tables on the flat ground next to the sand play area), and for the Sale Yards is the location of the bus in the Pony Club Grounds
- Head count is conducted
- All adults informed of the issue and a reactionary plan that will be carried out as a result with delegated roles and responsibilities provided to all to maintain health and safety
- First Aid provided if necessary
- Emergency services contacted if necessary
- Notify Country Kidz Centre of situation and Ministry of Education as appropriate
- Teachers and parent helpers take their allocated tamariki back to Country Kidz as soon as practicable
- Due to the number of adults and children participating in this event, two emergency kits will be carried
